CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – EXHIBITS

Exhibit entry nominations close on Friday August 19th 2022 at 5.00pm

Please get your entry forms in as early as possible.

Judging day will be Friday August 26th, 2022

- A. There will be no cost for exhibit entries
- B. Every exhibit **MUST** be the bona fide work of the exhibitor, both at the time of nomination and judging, and also Show Day
- C. The Appeals Committee may refuse entry to, or have removed from the grounds, any exhibit it believes to be dangerous and/or offensive.
- D. Should an exhibitor, having gained a prize, be subsequently disqualified for any reason, the next on the points list shall not necessarily be awarded the prize. The Appeals Committee shall, with or without the advice from the judge, decide the issue.
- E. Prizes may not necessarily be awarded in any section or class if, in the judge's opinion, there are insufficient entries or the entries are not of a high enough standard.
- F. Exhibition Hall doors shall be locked during judging, barring entry to all except YAS appointed officials with genuine business inside the exhibits hall.

ALL EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

- All exhibits **MUST** have a removable label with section, class and exhibitor's name – failure to do this could cause your exhibit to be placed in the wrong section.
- Please read carefully the Conditions of Entry and the Rules & Regulations contained in this schedule. Failure to do so could cause your exhibit to be disqualified or to be placed in the wrong section.
- Horticulture, One Person's Work and Collections exhibitors are required to set up their own exhibits completely, **before 10.00am Friday 26th August 2022.**
- All Photographic section entries **MUST** be sent with entry forms by Friday 19th August 2022 as specified in this schedule.
- It would greatly assist officials if entry forms are sent in as early as possible, and all exhibits are in place by **10.00am Friday 26th August 2022.**
- Please send entry forms suitably packaged to prevent loss or damage.
- Please send Photographic entries suitably packaged to prevent loss or damage.
- *All exhibits from the hall are to be collected by their owner or approved agent, between 4.00pm & 6.00pm on show day, and must be handed over by the section steward – exhibitors must not remove any exhibit without approval from a steward. Cleaning up of the exhibit hall will begin at 6.00pm any exhibits not collected by then will be locked away.*

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All exhibits MUST be in their appropriate sections by 10.00am Friday 26th August 2022.
2. Judging will commence at 11.00am Friday 26th August 2022.
3. No exhibit shall be removed from the hall until 4.00pm Saturday, and it must be removed by the exhibit owner or approved agent in the presence of the section hall steward.
4. Exhibits not complying with the required conditions may be placed in the appropriate sections by the Stewards in charge of those sections.
5. Hall stewards are required to report for duty to the Chief Hall Steward by 8.00am Friday 26th August 2022.
6. It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with or addressing a judge, and if necessary, and in consultation with the Chief Hall Steward, to order the removal of any such person from the hall.
7. ON NO ACCOUNT SHALL AN EXHIBITOR ADDRESS A JUDGE.
8. When making championship awards, Judges shall select only from exhibits that have gained first prize in eligible classes. This includes the Champion Exhibit award in Horticulture.
9. Section B only will be awarded ribbons: 1st place - blue ribbon, 2nd place - red ribbon.
10. Section B will be awarded sashes for Champions.
11. Sections D through to W - exhibits that have gained prizes in previous Y.A.S shows will be eligible for display only and MUST carry previous award cards.
12. Highly Commended award certificates shall only be awarded where merited.
13. The Y.A.S shall not be responsible for any incident that may occur to or by an exhibit or exhibitor, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Y.A.S. blameless & indemnified against loss, damage, injury or legal proceedings arising from such incident.
14. Every reasonable care shall be taken of exhibits by the Y.A.S., but no responsibility shall be incurred. Ordinary precaution shall be taken against fire and to protect the property of the Y.A.S and exhibitions, but exhibits will not be individually or collectively insured at the expense of the Y.A.S.
15. Protests against any award MUST be in writing on a formal Protest Form and should be accompanied by a \$25 fee. This fee will be forfeited to the Y.A.S should the protests be dismissed. All protests shall be presented to the Appeals Committee for consideration.
16. The decisions of the Appeals Committee shall be final & binding in all cases.
17. The Appeals Committee shall be headed by the Entries Secretary, and include: Secretary - YAS President, Chief Hall Steward and/or the Chief Ground Steward.
The Entries Secretary will have a casting vote if required.

TROPHIES - 2022

A trophy will be awarded in each section, to the exhibitor gaining the most points in that section, providing the exhibitor has entered 3 classes or more. (with the exception of sections J1/J2) - HOWEVER - in sections with sub-sections the following rule applies: "points must be gained in at least 3 classes in any one sub-section to be eligible for that sub-section trophy."

Points for trophy awards in all exhibit sections will be allocated as:

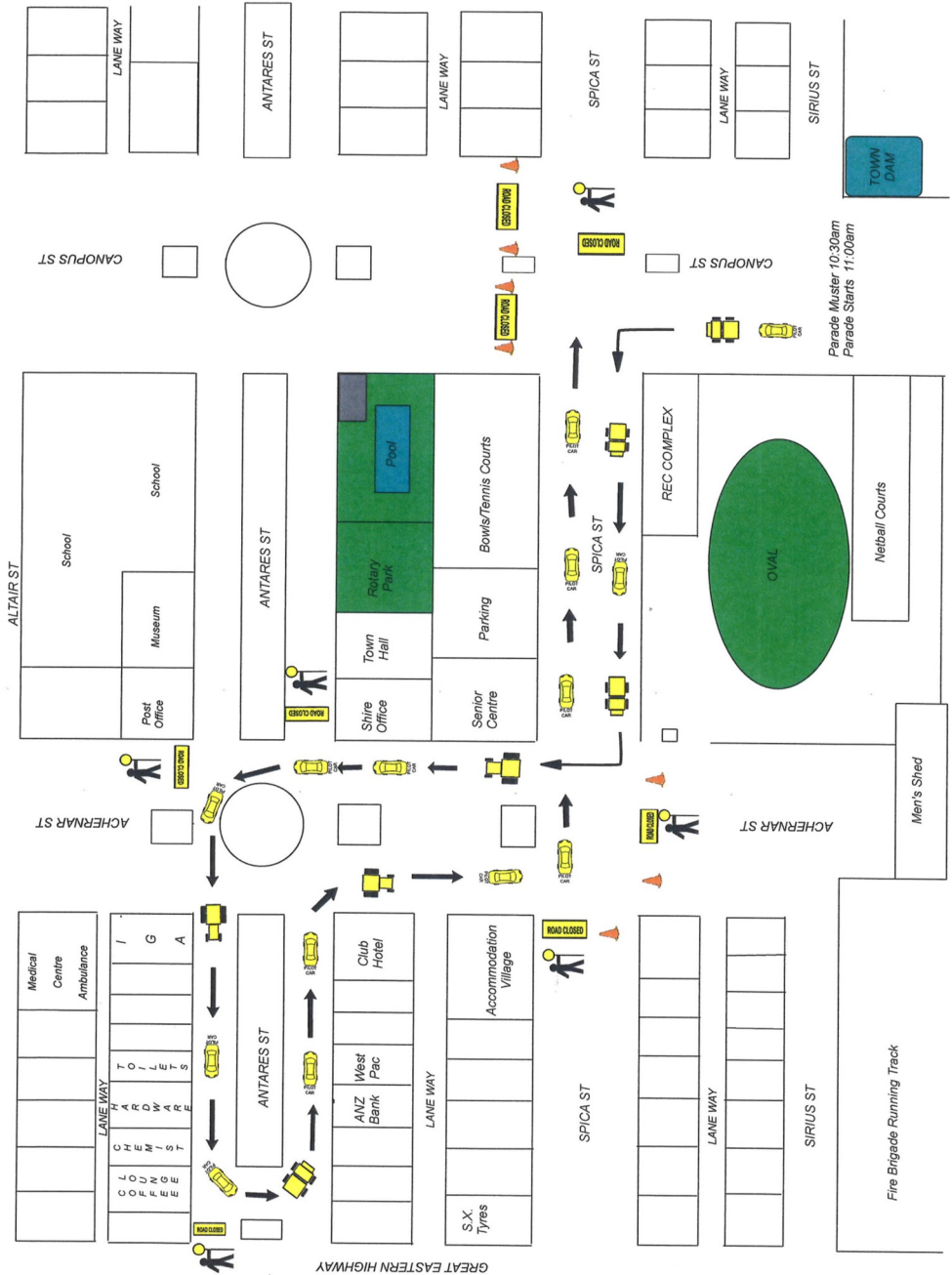

RICH FRUIT CAKE CHAMPIONSHIP

Ingredients:

250g butter	60g chopped red glace cherries
250g dark brown sugar	60g mixed peel
6 eggs	60g chopped almonds
250g sultanas	375g plain flour
250g raisins	1 tsp baking powder
200g currants	1 tsp mixed spice
100g dates	200ml sherry or brandy

Method:

Chop fruits, mix together and soak in the sherry or brandy overnight. Sift together flour, baking powder and spice. Cream together butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Then alternately add fruit and flour and lastly the chopped nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in a well prepared 19-22cm square tin, and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 to 3½ hours.

Note: Fruit should be cut to the size of currants.

HINTS FOR ABOVE COMPETITIONS:

1. Cakes should be cooked evenly all over – top, bottom and sides should be of even colour.
Points will be deducted for uneven cooking.
2. Cakes must be well cooked right through – no damp or soggy patches.
3. Fruit should be evenly distributed throughout cake.
4. Fruit should be moist and clean.
5. Cake is not to be iced or decorated with extra fruit and nuts.
6. Cake should be of a good even shape.
7. Points to be deducted for – cake rack marks, burnt edges, pieces of paper or foil which were not removed properly from cake, marks on cake from careless removal of paper.
8. All cakes will be cut by the judge.
9. Points to be allocated as follows:
 - Appearance 40 points
 - Cooking 20 points
 - Texture 20 points
 - Flavour 20 points

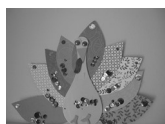
